Are your interested in buying or selling residential real estate in Maire? Refore you begin working with a real estate licensee it is important for you to understand that Maine Customer Law provides for different levels of brokerage service to largers and sellers. You should decide whether you want to be represented in

a travelation (as a client), or not (as a customer). To assist you in deciding which option is in your best interest, please review the following information about real estate brokerage relationships:

Naive law requires all real estate brokesage companies and their affiliated icenses (ficenses) to perform certain basic duties when dealing with a buyer or seller. You can expect a real estate licensee you deal with to provide the following customer-level survices:

- To disclose all malerial defects pertaining to the physical condifonct he real estate that are known by the foresee;
- To treat both the buyer and seller horrestly and not browingly give. lake information:
- √ To account for all money and properly received from or on helialf. of the bayer or seller, and
- √ To comply with all state and federal bars related to real estate. brokesaye activity.

Unit you enter into a written brokerage agreement with the licensee, for client level representation you are considered a "customer" and the licensee is not your agent. As a continuor, you should not expect the ficur-see to promote your heat interest, or to keep any information you give In the firmuse confidential, including your bargaining position.

COMPANY POLICY ON CLIENT-LEVEL SERVICES — WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW

The real estate brokerage company's pulicy on client-level services deterrines which of the three types of agent-client relationships permitted in Mains may be offered to you. The agent client relationships permitted in Naire are as follows:

- √ The company and all of its affiliated interests represent you. as a client (called "simple agency");
- \checkmark The company appoints, with your written consent, one or nate of the alliated increases to represent you as an appri(s) (saled "apprinted approxy");
- √ The company may offer limited agent level services as a ... disclosed dual agent.

WHAT IS A DISCLOSED DUAL AGENT?

In cortain siluations a licensee may act as an agent for and represent both the layer and the seller in the same transaction. This is called disclosed dual agency. Both the layer and the seller must consent to this type of representation in writing.

Working with a dual agent is not the same as leaving your corn earlysire agent as a single or appointed agent. For instance, when representing both a buyer and a seller, the dual agent must not disclose to one party any contributed information obtained from the other party.

Remember!

Unless you enter into a written agreement for agency representation, you are a customer—not a client.
